CONGESTION RELIEF: Not a project benefit. **AIR QUALITY BENEFIT:** None anticipated. **REGIONAL SYSTEM LINKAGE:** Would create a "Main Street" to entice travelers to shop and spend time in the City rather than pass through.

LAND USE COMPATIBILITY (PLANNED OR EXISTING): Consistent with the City's land use and transportation plans. The area recently received a grant from the Governor's Office for Small Cities for pedestrian improvements.

COMMUNITY OR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT: A "Main Street" would support the central business district in the City and would result in positive economic impacts. **ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES:** Low income and minority area.

BUSINESS OR HOUSING DISLOCATIONS: Not likely but if necessary, the City is prepared to obtain work release or temporary easements from adjacent property owners.

BICYCLING: Limited benefits through construction of shared use lanes.
