- Feature Presentation: Regional Vision Zero Action Plan Update (Carrie Ward)
 - Key outcomes include:



- building partnerships and a shared vision around regional roadway safety (using 4 E's)
- Developing a comprehensive Safety Implementation Program of fundable projects and have annual reporting on that program.
- \circ $\,$ We are adopting a Safe System Approach, which has had success in other countries.
 - Part of this will be adopting a vision zero target with a date.
- Includes equity analysis, safety analysis (data review, historic trends, network screening, high injury network, systemic safety analysis), speed limits to enable certain municipalities to reduce speed limit to 25 mph.
- We will use the above to develop a strategy and select projects, safety investigations at 40 sites, and policy and process changes, a transparent progress report, and a final vision zero action plan.
- o Discussion
 - Ivan wanted to note that fatalities per hundred miles is not a good metric to evaluate how safe or unsafe walking is because of the difference in scale
 - Also, fatalities are often a result of chance, serious injuries should also be considered
 - Charles Welge: Please note that Albany County Department of Health is recipient of GTSC Highway Safety grant program
 - Ed Brennan: ITSMR VRU fatality and serious injury data for Albany County and Albany City appears to have climbed sharply in 2022 and persisted in 2023 to levels unprecedented since ITSMR has published its data. Have other counties in our area seen this same issue? Is this vehicle size and speed? Intoxication? Any idea yet what is driving this?
 - Linda von der Heide: anecdote about pedestrians not checking the lights in Troy when crossing the street
 - Carrie Ward: we are looking at researching this, but this is not unique to Albany County or Albany City

 - Ivan Vamos: Discussed possible project in Menands, interested in restoring small boat river access called "Little River". There is support from Region 1 DOT and a study is underway by Hudson Greenway. There would be a walkway attached to the access. There are currently 65-year-old culverts there that are likely undersized. When these culverts are replaced, we'd like a bridge and other issues to be considered. Possibly in context with the 787 reimagination.
