The club is currently preparing to survey residents, participate in rides and walks, learn to fix bikes, and educate their community. Students are also using SUMO, an open source Open Street Map platform used for traffic modeling. Students are particularly interested in several busy roads through Clifton Park that lack sidewalks, bike lanes, or shared-use paths.

- Anvita wants to be able to walk to school (she lives very close to her school) but can't because of the danger and many lanes of Route 146.

Our Philosophy



- Car accidents happen too frequently, including around the Shen campus where speed limits are too high
- Many cyclists and pedestrians are forced to travel in dangerous ways because there are not many accommodations or rules to keep them safe
- Like explained before, cyclists and pedestrians do not get enough respect from drivers.
- For this reason, many people choose to not walk or bike to get to places because the risk level is just too high.

What we were doing before quarantine/ What we will do in the future


- We had reached out to Bikeatoga, and began learning how to fix bikes

- We had plans to have a Spring Open House meeting to get new club members. We will have to do this meeting online (and very soon!)




