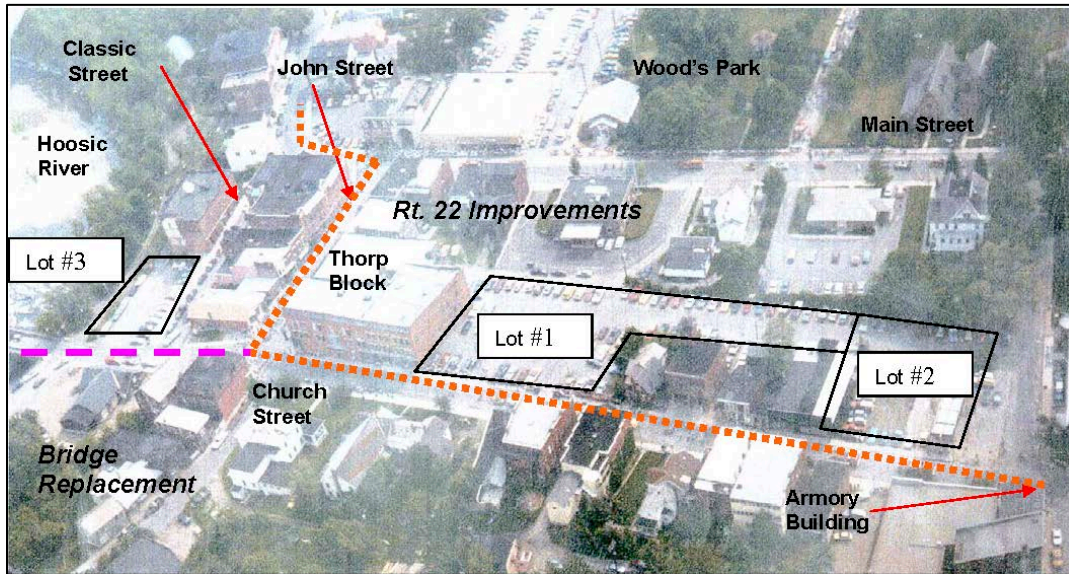


HOOSICK FALLS PARKING AND PEDESTRIAN STUDY



Parking lots and downtown study area in the Village of Hoosick Falls, New York.

Total Study Cost: \$30,000 consultant effort

Description: The Village of Hoosick Falls is pursuing initiatives to revitalize its downtown business district. The need for a plan of downtown parking and pedestrian facilities is vital not only to revitalization efforts but also to complement the reconstruction of NYS Route 22 through the Village's downtown. In particular, three municipal lots were analyzed as to how they could contribute to the overall function and appearance of downtown. Issues to be addressed in these municipal lots include: 1) streetscape appeal or identity to the Village historical character; 2) accommodations for pedestrian safety and amenities; and 3) organized mechanisms to control traffic flow. A number of recommendations were made for the Village to pursue ranging from developing waterfront connections to encouraging paved pedestrian paths, tree-planting and other improvements related to the reconstruction of Route 22.

This study was completed in June 2003.
