BALLSTON/MALTA ROUTE 67 CORRIDOR STUDY

Total Study Cost: \$50,000 (\$40,000 consultant effort plus \$10,000 in CDTC staff assistance)

Description: The Route 67 Corridor has experienced increased traffic demand as the surrounding towns have grown and projected development is expected to put increased pressure on the corridor. The goal of this study is to provide short-term (one- to six-year) solutions for improving the transportation infrastructure. Specifically, this study provides recommendations for intersection improvements, safe and more efficient roadway configurations and potential parallel access road configurations. Based upon known development proposals, the study also suggests ways to mitigate some of their negative traffic impacts if they are approved and eventually built. In addition, an access management plan was developed in an effort to improve ingress/egress throughout the corridor. The study also developed a bicycle and pedestrian plan to facilitate safe crossings of the corridor.
