

Spot Improvement Program
Round 5--Application Summaries

Albany County

City of Albany: Catherine Street Sidewalk between S. Swan and S. Hawk Streets
(\$50,000 federal/ \$94,540 local)

This project will construct a missing piece of sidewalk on Catherine Street between S. Swan and S. Hawk Streets. It will include ADA accessible detectable warning surfaces and crosswalks.

Village of Altamont: Sand Street Pedestrian Connection
(\$64,000 federal/\$16,000 local)

This project would construct approximately 600 feet of 5 foot wide sidewalk along the south side of Sand Street to the Upper Black Creek Tributary. The creek would be crossed by a 36 foot pre-fabricated bridge set an appropriate abutment structure which connects to the Altamont Elementary School.

Rensselaer County

Saratoga County

Town of Clifton Park: Clifton Park Center Road to Shenendehowa Campus: Access Safety Improvements
(\$36,320 federal/\$9,080 local)

This project will include a reflective crosswalk and appropriate signage on Clifton Park Center Road at the intersection with the southern terminus of School Drive. The project will also include construction of approximately 350 feet of off-road sidewalks along the southern shoulder of Clifton Park Center Road to connect the school crossing and crosswalk with adjacent Locust Lane Park and a traffic study to determine true use and volume with an associated gap analysis.

Town of Halfmoon: Pedestrian Signal Light and Pavement Marking Improvements at State Route 146 and Vosburgh Road

(\$37,812 federal/\$9,453 local)

This project includes a pedestrian signal light to be incorporated into a traffic signal being installed by a private developer. The project also includes an extension of the storm drain and minor landscaping.

Town of Malta: Route 9/Town Court Pedestrian Connectivity Project

(\$22,000 federal/\$6,000 local)

This project includes the construction of approximately 175 feet of sidewalk and installation of landscaping, benches and bike racks to provide bicycle and pedestrian access to the Town Court from Route 9 and the municipal parking lot.

City of Mechanicville: Mechanicville Pedestrian Improvements

(\$49,200 federal/\$12,300 local)

This project includes improvements to 3 intersections 1) Central Avenue/Mabbett Avenue/Hill Street, 2) Central Avenue/Park Avenue and 3) Main Street/Park Avenue. All 3 intersections will include new stop lines, crosswalks, sidewalk repairs and curbing.

City of Saratoga Springs: The Core Area Mobility Impaired Accessibility Improvement Program

(\$24,000 federal/\$6,000 local)

This project will repair or replace selected core area curb ramps to make them more handicapp accessible. The locations will be prioritized by the City should funding be awarded.

Town of Stillwater: Campbell Park Trailhead

(\$83,360 federal/\$20,840 local)

This project will include the construction of approximately 30 feet of trail along with signage, seating, bollards, fencing, crosswalks, two trail heads and a small parking area to better connect the existing trail system with the rest of the Town.

Schenectady County

Town of Niskayuna: Cornelius Avenue Sidewalks

(\$213,600 federal/\$53,400 local)

This project will include the construction of approximately 1500 feet of sidewalk on Cornelius Avenue between Ray Street and Hillside Elementary School which will link to existing sidewalk.

Town of Rotterdam: Hamburg Street Sidewalk Connection

(\$65,000 federal/\$25,000 local)

This project will include the construction of approximately 900 feet of 5 foot wide sidewalk along the east side of Hamburg Street from Arlene Street to East Campbell Road.

City of Schenectady: Seneca Street and Maxon Road Canalway Trail Crossing

(\$62,400 federal/\$15,600 local)

This project will include improvements to the Canalway Trail crossings at both Seneca Street and Maxon Road. This will be incorporated into the City's larger DPW project in that area and a request to bundle with TIP project S 140 will be made.

Schenectady County: Nott Street Sidewalk Extension

(\$73,600 federal/\$18,400 local)

This project will include construction of approximately 925 feet of 5 foot wide sidewalk from Keyes Avenue to Lexington Parkway. This project also includes a 120 foot retaining wall and 190 feet of granite curbing.

Schenectady County: Mohawk-Hudson Bike-Hike Trail Informational Kiosks

(\$17,600 federal/\$4,400 local)

This project will include construction of two informational kiosks along the MHBHT. One is proposed for the western terminus of the off-road trail at the intersection of Nott and Washington Avenue. The second is proposed where the trail terminates at Jay Street.
