## I-787 LIVABLE CORRIDOR PLANNING STUDY

**Description:** The Capital District Transportation Committee (CDTC) is the designated metropolitan planning organization (MPO) charged with carrying out federal requirements for cooperative transportation planning and programming within the metropolitan area surrounding the Albany and Saratoga Springs urbanized areas in New York State. The I-787 Livable Corridor Planning Study is an integrated, multi-modal transportation and land use planning study of the I-787 corridor from roughly Exit 2 to the southern Exit 9 ramps in Albany County, New York. This initiative will primarily focus on the waterfront areas of the City of Albany, City of Watervliet, Village of Menands and the Town of Colonie for the I-787 mainline corridor, its related structures and access roads. The primary objectives of this initiative are to:

- 1) Identify, with direct assistance from NYSDOT and CDTC staff, the short and long term infrastructure needs including life-cycle costs for I-787 and its related access roads;
- 2) undertake a public involvement effort and visioning exercise;
- 3) identify feasible near-term access improvements to support multi-modal transportation objectives, as well as waterfront revitalization and economic development initiatives such as downtown and brownfield redevelopment; and
- 4) identify feasible strategies, based on long term infrastructure needs that would reduce infrastructure maintenance costs and improve transportation/community compatibility.

This study is being undertaken by CDTC, in partnership with the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) and the City of Albany. CDTC, on behalf of the study partners, will administer the consultant contract.

The project is expected to last *no more than twelve calendar months* from the date of contract execution with a \$320,000 budget for consultant assistance (this should be considered the upset amount of the contract).
