

Amendments to the 2007-12 TIP

At its March 5, 2009 meeting, CDTC made the following amendments to the Transportation Improvement Program regarding the programming of Stimulus funds.

1. Stimulus Funds for Highway Projects

Although at the time of the Planning Committee meeting, the amount of stimulus funds available to CDTC was not yet known, the staffs from CDTC and Region One made a reasonable estimate of \$70M, of the \$87M for the entire Region One area. The \$70M is to be spent on existing TIP projects first, with the remainder spent on new projects that are quick to implement.

Existing TIP Projects: Region One would use its project selection authority to change fund sources of projects to stimulus funds at the time of obligation. Since these projects will not show in the listings as funded by stimulus funds until obligation, there may be an unspent balance of stimulus funds temporarily showing in the CDTC TIP summary tables.

New Projects: It is anticipated that existing projects will not use all the stimulus funds. Therefore, the provision to spend the balance is to create the below set-asides for mostly element specific projects that can be implemented quickly. These projects will show in the listings with their maximum expected funding. Actual funding is likely to be less, depending on how much is used on existing projects.

Project Selection Guidelines for Set-Asides: According to current project selection guidelines, only Planning Committee approval is required to add projects from a set-aside to the TIP, and reduce the set-aside's funds by the corresponding amount, regardless of the amount of funds in question. However, to lower or raise the available funds of a set-aside by over 50% (minimum \$1M) or more than \$3M, Policy Board approval is necessary. Given the urgent nature of stimulus expenditures, the assumed need to adhere to fiscal constraint requirements, and the likelihood of the need to reduce these set-aside amounts to fund existing projects as they become available; as a separate action, the Policy Board authorized the Planning Committee to make all necessary changes to these specific set-asides to accommodate changes to the program.

2. Stimulus Funds for Transit Projects

Rather than add stimulus funds to two projects, all stimulus funds are added to one project (T17, Transit Bus Replacement/Expansion), which frees some funds to add to T57 (Preventive Maintenance). As always, all funding is shown for completeness, but because there are so many individual phases, the lines with changes are in bold print as a visual aid.

3. Competitive Discretionary Stimulus Funds for Transit Projects T17 (Transit Buses), T69 & T70 (NY 5 BRT Vehicles and Stations), and S170, Western Gateway Transportation Center

Grant monies have recently been made available from the FTA. A condition for application for these funds is that the project be on the Statewide Transportation Improvement Plan (STIP) with the possible funding already showing in the listing. These projects are already on the TIP, but are being amended to include these discretionary funds. The funding shown below for T17 is in addition to that shown above.

The funding for S170 was also updated regarding phases and schedule for the other fund sources. Funding changes are shown in the top section. Phase changes are shown in the lower section. Both sections show schedule changes. The total matched federal funding would increase from \$5.600M to \$10.100M.

4. Discretionary Stimulus Funds for Railroad Projects: A395 & S150 (1935.52), Rensselaer to Schenectady Double Track

The project for installing a second main railroad track between Albany and Schenectady was previously on the TIP as A395 and S150 (Rensselaer to Schenectady Double Track) as part of the AMTRAK/NYSDOT Rail Initiative. It was subsequently removed from the TIP. It is being brought back now and funded with discretionary Railroad Stimulus funds.
