**Capital District Transportation Committee
2019-24 Transportation Improvement Program
Draft Project Listings**

The Draft 2019-24 Project Listings will be released for public review after Planning Committee approval at its April 2019 meeting. **It is imperative that all sponsors review the listings for their projects and notify CDTC staff of any problems, concerns, errors, etc. as soon as possible.** Of course, all members are invited to examine the entire list of projects also. Please note that any errors that are not corrected have the possibility of becoming the actual final TIP and might require Planning Committee and Policy Board action to correct later.

The draft project listings are intended to be the complete list of projects with funding programmed as appropriate. As such, the draft listings include the following:

- 1) All projects in the 2016-21 TIP that are being retained in the 2019-24 TIP. If a project is in the 2016-21 TIP and does not appear in these draft listings, then no funding would be available in the 2019-24 TIP.
- 2) All set-asides. The NYSDOT set-asides have not been presented to the Planning Committee until these listings. They accurately reflect the total amounts by year and fund source approved earlier in this TIP Update.
- 3) All new projects programmed at the February 27 and March 20, 2019 Planning Committee meetings.
- 4) All phases for the new projects.
- 5) All proposals for fiscal constraint made between the March 20 and April 3 Planning Committee meetings. These include schedule and fund source changes and are shown on the accompanying attachment.
- 6) All schedule and fund source change requests made by NYSDOT Region One between the March 20 and April 3 Planning Committee meetings. These are shown on the accompanying schedule and fund source changes attachment.
- 7) Programming of transit funds proposed by CDTA. These are funds from FTA included in the "T" projects.
- 8) Post period projects that were in the 2016-21 TIP and those added at the February 27 and March 20, 2019 Planning Committee meetings.
- 9) New projects show the CDTC candidate number instead of the DOT PIN. For example, project A573 has a PIN of "Cand 7", which stands for CDTC candidate project number 7. This way, you can find a project by candidate numbers used in programming. DOT PIN's will replace candidate numbers eventually.
